A FORUM FOR:

- Committed representatives of the Canadian film, broadcasting and new media industries, government, diversity communities and other training institutions to study concrete policies, formulate strategies and discuss programs to ensure the fair representation of Canada's multicultural and multiracial diversity in film, broadcasting and other media productions.
- Leaders on diversity in Canadian film, broadcasting and new media industries to exchange ideas on promising practices and to develop concrete initiatives to promote racial and cultural diversity in their business operations and products.

This Forum is designed to be a national gathering of stakeholders and decision-makers who are actively working towards making diversity into a cornerstone of Canadian communications and culture in the 21st century. The Forum is a response to changes in the Canadian social, cultural, political, economic and technological landscapes of the last few years and to continuing issues of under- and biased representation of large numbers of Canadians in film, broadcasting and other media productions. The Forum will also examine emerging issues such as access to ownership of ethnic media, regulatory issues for broadcast and new media content, multiculturalism and the Canadian content policy, and the CRTC's call for an industry-community task force on cultural diversity in broadcasting.

THE FORUM WILL GENERATE:

- proposals for new legislative, regulatory and administrative policies on Canadian film, broadcasting and new media;
- plans for innovative training, mentorship and internship projects, including working groups;
- elements of a national network of stakeholders on racial and cultural diversity in Canadian media, including a national mediawatch operation;
- strategies for more effective implementation and equitable enforcement of laws and regulations on racial and cultural diversity in communications and culture;
- outlines for a framework for international cooperation on racial and cultural diversity in film, broadcasting and new media.
