ROGER SINHA

Choreographer, Dancer and Artistic Director of Sinha Danse



Montreal-based Sinha Danse was founded by Artistic Director, Roger Sinha in 1991. Born in Britain to parents of Indian and Armenian descent, Sinha developed his company as a vehicle for his distinctive hybrid choreography. His work enriches the vocabulary of contemporary dance by infusing the techniques of Bharata Natyam with the fullbodied movement of modern dance. Compelled by his cultural origins, Sinha creates a dynamic tension between the intimate and the universal. resulting in a contemporary expression of his reality that is passionate, personal and challenging. Selected works by

Roger Sinha include Thok (2002), Loha (2000), Le Jardin des Vapeurs (1997), Chai (1997), From a Crack in the Earth...Light (1995), and Burning Skin (1992).

Sinha Danse has performed extensively at major festivals in Canada including the Canada Dance Festival, Montréal en Lumières. Dancing on the Edge Festival and FIND. Internationally, Sinha Danse has presented works at the prestigious Place Theatre (London) as part of the Vivarta Festival of South Asian Performance and has been showcased at the Spring Dance Festival in Utrecht (Holland), Danse à Lille (France), Summer Stage Series in Central Park (New York) and the New Directions in Indian Dance festival in New Delhi.

Roger Sinha's newest work, Apricot Trees Exist is a piece for six dancers inspired by Alphabet, the book length, celebrated epic poem of Danish experimentalist Inger Christensen. Apricot Trees Exist will premiere in October 2004 at L'Agora de la danse in Montréal.

Natasha Bakht

Dancer / Collaborator Loha

Natasha Bakht is an Indian contemporary dancer and choreographer. Natasha trained in Bharata Natyam under Menaka Thakkar for 20 years and has worked with choreographers Joan Phillips, Hari Krishnan, Wayne McGregor, Shobana Jeyasingh and Robert Desrosiers. Her personal choreography includes three solos entitled Dance If You Must Appropriating Edges and Obiter Dictum which was nominated for a 2003 Dora Mayor Moore Award for Outstanding New Choreography. Loha is her second collaborative work with Roger Sinha.

Thomas Casey

Dancer - Thok

Tom Casey completed a bachelor of arts 'ex honoris' in dance at the University of Winnipeg. As a member of Winnipeg Contemporary Dancers he traveled to Montréal to remount choreographer Jean-Pierre Perreault's classic, JOE. In April, 2004 he will return to the cast of JOE for the show's 20th anniversary world tour. With Sinha Danse Tom is able to explore dance as a mixture of 'meaningful gesture' (as words on a page) and pure movement in the dynamic sense. Tom is grateful to have been actively collaborating with Sinha Danse since 1996.

Sophie Lavigne Dancer - Thok

Sophie Lavigne studied dance at the Université du Québec à Montréal, completing her baccalaureate studies in dance education in 1995 and dance interpretation in 1998. Since 1996, she has worked with choreographers Gaétan Gingras, Ginette Prévost, Motaz Kabbani and she now dances with the Lynda Gaudreau's Compagnie.

Magdalena Nowecka began her formation in contemporary dance at St-Laurent College in Montreal and pursued her studies at les Ateliers de danse moderne de Montréal before working with Lucie Gregoire Danse in 2003. She teaches dance at L'Ecole Nos voix, nos visages and is preparing a piece to be shown at Tangente in the fall of 2004. She joined Sinha Danse in June, 2003.



Ganesh Anandan Composer / Musician - Loha

Originally from Bangalore, South India, composer, percussionist and instrument designer Ganesh Anandan has worked with a wide range of artists including dancers Roger Sinha, Hideo Arai (Japan), Motaz Kabbani, Peter Chin, Mariko Tanabe and Lin Snelling. He has performed / recorded with Glen Velez (USA), Ensemble Modern (Germany), Oregon (USA), Ramesh Shotham (India/Germany), Carlo Rizo (Italy / France) and Michel Cusson. His two latest CD releases are entitled Speaking in Tongues (Ambiences Magnetiques) and Imaginaria (Independent).

Rainer Wiens

Composer / Musician - Loha

Rainer Wiens is a composer, guitarist, and kalimbaist. He has composed music for dance, theatre and film, and his published works are part of the permanent collection of the Museum of Modern Art (NY). He has recorded / performed with NOMA, Steve Lacy, René Lussier, Ganesh Anandan, Jean Derome, Pierre Tanguay, Martin Tetrault and Malcolm Goldstein. Rainer's latest CD Speaking in Tongues is available on the Ambiances Magnetiques label.

Sophie Michaud

Rehearsal Director / Assistant Choreographer

Sophie Michaud has been focusing her energies towards her freelance work as an Assistant Choreographer and Rehearsal Director since 1990. She completed a MA in dance at UQAM in 1996. She has collaborated with numerous dance companies and independent choreographers including Cas Public, PPS Danse, Mariko Tanabe Danse, Bouge de là, Mia Maure Danse, Kondition Pluriel, Manon fait de la danse and Corpuscule Danse.
